### Greetings,

Being stopped for a driving violation is very difficult for a person who cannot hear the police. The Delaware Office for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DODHH) offers visor communication cards, available for free on a voluntary basis (only if you want one). The visor cards are for individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, oral deaf and severely hard of hearing.

The visor communication card is laminated and 10 ½ by 4 ½ inches size. It is thin and lightweight. It is designed to fit under the car's sun visor for quick communication access in traffic stops or other interactions with law enforcement. On the front of the card is information to instruct to the police officer, and on the back of the card are tips to instruct to the driver in using the visor card.

To request a visor communication card, please fill out the request for information form. Visor cards are limited to one per person, and <u>only residents of Delaware are eligible</u>.

The form must be signed by a professional who can confirm that the person has a hearing loss and will be helped by having a visor card. A professional person can be a vocational rehabilitation counselor, social work counselor, or audiologist.

For the high school students who are deaf or hard of hearing, a special educational specialist or school audiologist may sign the form.
